

**Association of Reproductive Health Professionals (ARHP)  
Continuing Medical Education (CME) Conflict of Interest Policy**

A conflict of interest may be considered to exist if a continuing medical education program faculty (speaker or editor) and/or an immediate family member is affiliated with or has a significant relationships (receive research grants, speaker's bureau membership, consultancies, honoraria and travel, other benefits from a company) in any organization(s) that may have a **direct interest** in the subject matter of presentation.

The intent of this policy is not to prevent a speaker with an affiliation or financial interest from making a presentation. It is intended that any potential conflict be identified openly so that the listeners have the full disclosure of the facts and may form their own judgments about the presentation. A reasonable test to guide decisions about what to disclose is whether any particular affiliation could cause embarrassment to the individual or institution involved, or lead to questions about the speaker's motives, if such affiliation(s) were made known to the general public.

Significant relationships will be listed within an educational activity final program or publication.

For example:

If Dr. Doe has an affiliation:

John Doe, MD  
Assistant Professor, Department of Obstetrics/Gynecology,  
ABC University Medical Center, City, State;  
Research Consultant, XYZ Pharmaceuticals, City, State

Or, if Dr. Doe has a significant relationship:

John Doe, MD  
Assistant Professor, Department of Obstetrics/Gynecology,  
ABC University Medical Center, City, State;  
Stockholder, XYZ Pharmaceuticals, City, State
