
Dear Friends and Colleagues:

Thank you for participating in *Reproductive Health 2011* and for being a part of this dedicated community of reproductive health professionals.







HOW TO OBTAIN CREDIT

Obtaining Continuing Education (CE) Credits for *Reproductive Health 2011*

An efficient and eco-friendly process is in place for electronically gathering conference evaluations, facilitating participants' claiming of CE credits, and distributing certificates.

To Receive Your CE Certificate for the General Conference:

- Immediately following the meeting, check your e-mail for a message from the conference staff.
- Click on the link provided and complete the conference evaluation.
- At the end of the evaluation, click on the link directing you to claim your CE credits. Only claim credit commensurate with the extent of your participation in the activity. You must claim the actual number of credits in order to receive CE credit and a certificate.

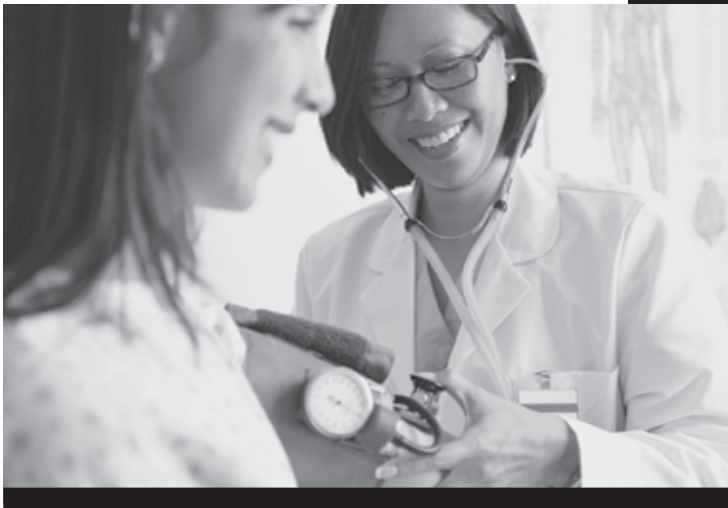

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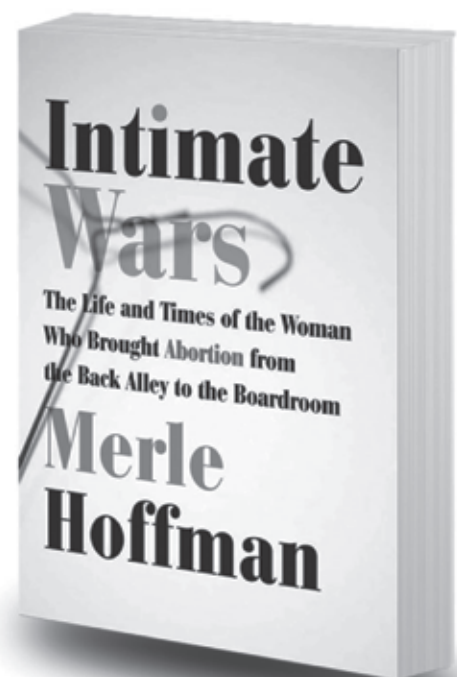

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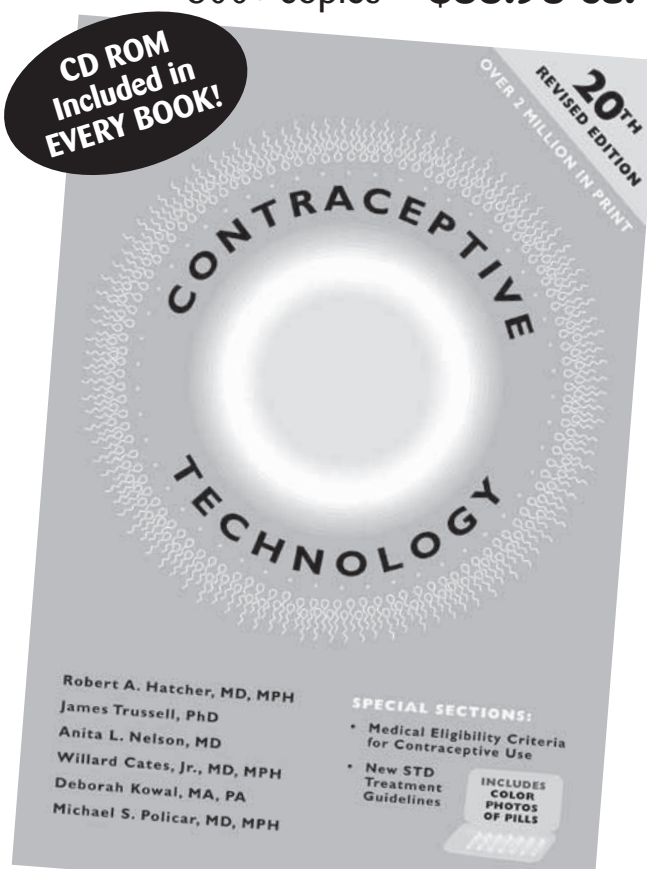
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
