ABOUT REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH 2007

This year's conference will include the latest information on contraception, reproductive cancers, infertility, abortion, sexually transmitted infections, sexuality, reproductive genetics, and more. It will also feature scientific abstracts and presentations in reproductive health.

Target Audience

The audiences that may best benefit from the conference include nurse practitioners, nurse midwives, physicians, physician assistants, pharmacists, students, educators and researchers who practice or work within the United States and abroad.

Accreditation

All participants successfully completing the conference will receive a statement of credit approximately one month following the sessions. To successfully complete requirements for credit, participants must sign in at the registration desk and attend sessions.

Physicians – ARHP is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to provide continuing medical education for physicians. ARHP designates the pre-conference sessions for up to 3.5 credit hours and general sessions for up to 16 credit hours in Category One of the Physicians Recognition Award of the Medical Association. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists has assigned 4 cognate hours (formal learning) to the pre-conferences, and 16 cognate hours (formal learning) to the general sessions. Up to 18.5 credits have been assigned by the American Academy of Family Physicians. This includes 18.75 Prescribed and 1.5 Elective credits. Because some sessions run concurrently, no more than 18.75 credits may be reported. **Elective credit only for "Religion and Sexuality" and no credit for "PPFA Clinical Issues/Discussions."*

Physician Assistants – American Academy of Physician Assistants accepts Category One CME approval from organi-

zations accredited by the ACCME to grant Category One hours toward the Physician's Recognition Award. Physician assistants attending this meeting may report up to 3.5 credit hours for pre-conference sessions and 16 credit hours for general sessions.

Nurse Midwives – ACCME credit hours in Category One are accepted by the Continuing Competency Assessment Program of the American College of Nurse Midwives for programs relevant to nurse midwifery. Nurse midwives attending this meeting may report up to 3.5 credit hours for pre-conference sessions and 16 credit hours for general sessions.

Nurse Practitioners – This educational activity has been approved by the Continuing Education Approval Program of the National Association of Nurse Practitioners in Women's Health. NPWH designates 3.5 contact hours for each pre-conference, and 16 contact hours for the general sessions. Pharmacology hours have not yet been determined.

Pharmacists – The Association of Reproductive Health Professionals (ARHP) is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education as a Provider of continuing pharmacy education. The assigned universal program number for the general sessions is 463-000-07-001-L04; this program provides 16 contact hours of continuing education credit. Each pre-conference provides 4 contact hours of continuing education credit.

Expected Outcomes

At the conclusion of Reproductive Health 2007, participants will be able to:

- Apply new knowledge and understanding to the diagnosis and treatment of men and women for a variety of reproductive health conditions.
- Provide improved guidance to patients on family planning, including lessons learned from international research.
- Enhance the effectiveness of communication with patients.
- Incorporate an understanding of current social and legal issues affecting reproductive health care into professional practice.

Pre-conference Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of the **Focus on Health Literacy: Skills for Effective Communication with Patients** pre-conference session, participants will be able to:

- Describe the relationship between educational attainment level and probable reading level.
- Identify evidence-based criteria for readable written patient education materials.
- Describe techniques for improving the likelihood that patients will use their patient education materials after the office visit or education session.
- Identify specific words/jargon that are likely to be perceived as difficult or unfamiliar to the majority of patients.
- Analyze the reading level of a document using a readability formula.
- Recognize layout, linguistic, and graphic design aspects of documents that affect reading ease.

At the conclusion of **The Connection Between Environmental Factors and Reproductive Health** pre-conference session, participants will be able to:

- Summarize the scientific literature on the impacts of environmental contaminants on reproductive health in adolescents, men, and women.
- Identify environmental contaminants of highest concern.
- State clinical care recommendations related to environmental contaminants that have the potential to improve reproductive health.
- Identify talking points to educate patients on reduction of environmental contaminants during various stages, including preconception, pregnancy, postnatal, pubertal, and adult.
- Describe how clinicians can work effectively with community based organizations to improve environmental factors related to reproductive health within communities.

At the conclusion of the **A Clinical Update on Intrauterine Contraception** pre-conference session, participants will be able to:

- Name the two forms of intrauterine contraception available in the United States.
- Rank efficacy associated with intrauterine contraceptives compared with other contraceptive methods.
- List three selection criteria for appropriate candidates for intrauterine contraception.
- Identify two possible side effects of each type of intrauterine contraceptive.
- Develop skills required for proper insertion techniques for the two methods of intrauterine contraception.
- Discuss strategies for follow-up of intrauterine contraceptive users.

At the conclusion of the **Wading through the Headlines: Understanding the Real Science Behind the Hype** pre-conference session, participants will be able to:

- List skills necessary for critical appraisal of scientific literature and for clinical decisions.
- Understand techniques for designing, conducting, and assessing scientific studies.
- Understand how to best design effective and efficient approaches to disease prevention and treatment.
- Examine the association between relative risk and clinical issues.
- Review basic statistical testing and common pitfalls in their use.
